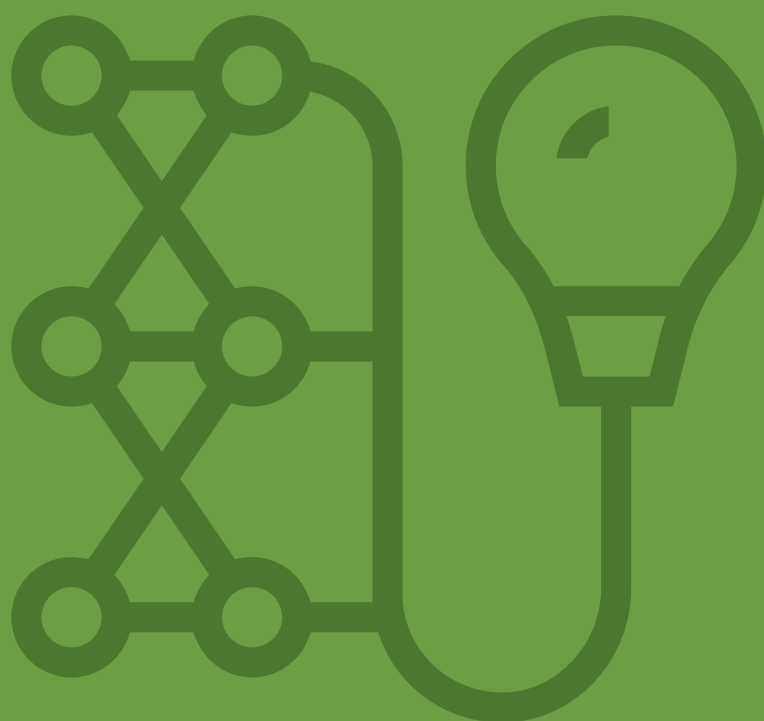

## Definition
